Kate Roberts, Director at the HTSA, led the session and it is safe to say our participants had fun, learnt loads and gained valuable knowledge that will allow them to increase engagement and enjoyment in their classrooms. They participated in activities such as transporting oily jelly cubes with chopsticks from one container to another, building spaghetti houses to hold kinder eggs, and experimenting with liquid and absorbent materials; activities that are sure to keep students in the classroom entertained.

They have two more sessions and a final project to complete in order to finish the course.
